The Stadio Olimpico hosted the 1960 Summer Olympics, 6 games during the 1990 World Cup and 4 European Cup Finals.







The San Siro Stadium hosted 6 games during the 1990 World Cup and the 2001, 1970 and 1965 European Cup Finals.






