
BRAZIL NATIONAL

The Maracana Stadium hosted the 1950 World Cup and the 2014 World Cup with 7 matches including the Final.








BELO HORIZONTE

The Mineirao Stadium hosted 6 games during the 2014 World Cup and games during the 2016 Summer Olympics.








BRASILIA






FORTALEZA

It is a modern stadium built on an island close to Rio de Janeiro.








MANUAS






RIO DE JANEIRO

The Maracana Stadium hosted the 1950 World Cup and the 2014 World Cup with 7 matches including the Final.








SALVADOR
